Blackfoot: Kitsikakomimm Na-a (I love you mom)

Inuktituk: Nagligivagit (I love you)

Hlgaagilda Xaayda Kil (Skidegate Dialect) :

- x Dang ga dii k'uuga ga (Dang= You Dii= I K'uuga= Love)
- x Guuga gas (loved one in baby talk)
- x Awga daaga dii k'uuga ga (I love you mom) (Awga=mom Daaga=You

Learning Tips:

- x Learning new languages can be awkward, you may feel silly when trying to say a new word, you might feel afraid to make mistakes, however, remember that that is perfectly normal. Just think of your self as a little baby learning how to talk, it gets easier with practice
- x Orthography: is the written/spelling of the language. It can be challenging at times , focus on the oral aspects of the words; with practice it can be fun to learning new symbols.
- x *It's important to note that each nation will have different dialects, which means the words/phrases will sound slightly different, therefore all will be correct. A dialect just indicates the language of a specific area/region.
